UPCOMING

Amid the COVID-19 outbreak, the youth are looking at **creative ways to communicate ideas**. In Addis Ababa, 22 year old Fatima Ahmed Hayuti is using her talent as an artist to produce child friendly images about preventative measures around COVID-19. Her art will soon be available on our website. In the art sphere, TRS holds joint refugee art therapy workshops and exhibitions with ZOA International in Addis Ababa. The sessions provide refugees with a space for tranquility and relief away from the day to day struggles and trauma.

Recreational activities are known to provide refugees with much needed psychosocial benefitsž TRS promotes positive engagement through football and art in Ethiopia and Sudan. In Khartoum, weekly football tournaments were organized before the COVID-19 lock-down. The tournaments provided the youth with the opportunity to socialize and In integrate vulnerable people into the community. Eastern Sudanł workshops on Forum Theatre, a form of theatre that encourages audience interaction and explores different options for dealing with a problem, were conducted with a refugee theater group.

Awareness raising in school is an important component of TRS activities in Ethiopia and Sudan. These sessions serve to provide information on issues related to the difficulties that children who sought the help of smugglers may face. As part of the activities, the children watch TRS animated films available in Arabic and Tigrinya and have discussions about the TRS children book "The Journey"

TRS facilitated a meeting in Munich, Germany with the Eritrean diaspora to discuss the ongoing risk that persons face when moving to and through Libya. The community called for more visibility on information on a legal and complementary pathways. TRS has since included family reunification contact details on the website and would continue to share information on legal pathways when made available.
